

## Filming in the City of North Vancouver

*With spectacular mountains and forests, city skylines and industrial landscapes, the City of North Vancouver offers unparalleled beauty and a diversity of locations suitable for filming.*

The combination of new urban buildings, heritage homes, and turn-of-the-century commercial spaces bring together the past, present and future into one location. Many attractive neighbourhoods and parks add to the possibilities and a vast array of amenities make the City of North Vancouver the City of choice for filming.

### Some prime locations available for filming include:

- Harbourside Business Park & Kings Mill Walk
- The City Parks including; Mosquito Creek, Heywood, Mahon, Waterfront and Boulevard Park
- North Vancouver Cemetery
- The Lower Lonsdale area
- A diversity of homes and buildings already registered for filming with the BCFC

To reserve the Pier for filming, simply print and fill out the City's film application form available online and fax it to the attention of the Film Coordinator. The location must be approved prior to proceeding with all other applications, permits and licensing. Electrical permits are required for all movie sets when using a generator.

# Filming at The Pier



The Burrard Dry Dock Pier, St. Roch Dock and Goldsworthy Pier

*From urban skylines and nautical scenes, to turn-of-the-century industrial buildings and beautiful shorelines, the Pier facility offers a diversity of backdrops and settings for any film production.*

## The City's Newest Filming Hot Spot

At the site of the historic Versatile Shipyards at the foot of Lonsdale, this new public amenity features the 700ft long Burrard Dry Dock Pier, and the smaller floating St. Roch Dock. Both extend into Burrard Inlet and allow for spectacular 360 degree views of the North Shore mountains, Burrard Inlet and Vancouver skylines, and can accommodate a wide variety of craft and equipment needs.

Located a short twenty-minute drive from downtown Vancouver, the Burrard Dry Dock Pier and St. Roch Dock are open daily from 6:00am to 11:00pm for a sneak peak at the newest filming hot spot.



## The Burrard Dry Dock Pier

The Burrard Dry Dock Pier is best suited to accommodate oversized commercial, naval and recreational vessels up to 134m in length. Located 150m east of the big "Q" at Lonsdale Quay. Facilities available for film crews include:

- Use of the 700ft long, 50ft wide public promenade
- Moorage of vessels up to 134m long with a 4770 tonne displacement
- 15 amp electrical supply
- Water facilities
- Adequate fenders to be provided by mooring vessel
- Pier vehicle load capacity of 15,000kg (5400kg front axel, 9500kg rear axel)
- Parking and street access

## St. Roch Dock

Smaller vessels such as leisure crafts up to 25m in length can moor at the St. Roch Dock. Located just east of Lonsdale Quay, this smaller floating dock and larger upper deck are nestled between the Burrard Dry Dock Pier and Cates Tugs operations. Facilities available for film crews include:

- Use of the 98ft long, 10ft wide floating dock and 89ft long, 33ft wide upper deck
- Moorage of vessels up to 25m long with a 66 tonne displacement
- Water facilities
- Timber bull rail and rub rails, 4 cleats per side
- No vehicle load capacity
- Parking and street access



## Goldsworthy Pier

### Looking for Another Waterfront Location?

The City of North Vancouver boasts unparalleled access to waterfront locations through parks, piers and private properties. Just west of Lonsdale Quay and the new Pier facility, Waterfront Park provides access to Goldsworthy Pier, a smaller floating dock capable of mooring small vessels.

## Harbourside Business Park and Kings Mill Walk

The nearby Harbourside Business Park and Kings Mill Walk are also available for filming and provide new location opportunities for waterfront filming.
