Executive Summary

The new Harry Jerome Community Recreation Centre Project and the Silver Harbour Seniors' Activity Centre (HJCRC/SH) is well underway. Construction activities continue with the concrete works for the parkade level almost complete! Up next will be the start of the structural steel installation. Other construction is focused on mechanical and electrical rough-in's and construction detail mock-ups. This project is the largest investment ever in community recreation in the City of North Vancouver and will provide more than 18,580 sq.m. of inclusive and accessible community space to support our community's physical, mental and social well-being.

Naming Theme Takes Flight

There will be number of multi-purpose rooms and flexible spaces throughout the new HJCRC. To ensure these spaces are easy to identify by users, rooms will be named after birds that make their home on the North Shore. This wayfinding approach provides a wide range of opportunities to differentiate and animate each space to reflect its namesake. Colours, graphics and integration of local stories can all help to bring these room names to life!



The North Shore Bird naming theme includes potential names such as Heron, Mallard, Hummingbird, Chickadee, Kinglet, Warbler, Merganser, Finch, Sparrow or Owl.
