Existing conditions

Hamersley Park is one of the largest neighbourhood parks in Lower Lonsdale (.488 ha). Mature trees along the park edges, dense understory and steep slopes define the character of the park.

As part of the site analysis of the park to help determine priorities for improvement, we will be updating our 2010 tree assessment and the RCMP will complete a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design Report (CPTED).

Proposed park improvements


Hamersley Park is a green oasis in a dense residential neighbourhood. In addition to being a place for play, this park is an important pedestrian connection between East 3rd and 1st Street.

Preliminary ideas for park improvements aim to expand the existing play area and increase pedestrian access to green space.

The proposed park improvements will include:

- New, engaging play opportunities
- Improved pedestrian facilities and greater accessibility
- Enhancing natural features by improving conditions for tree and plant health
- Enhancing the unique character of the park

LOWER LONSDALE OFF-LEASH AREA




Lower Lonsdale is an underserved neighbourhood for off-leash facilities.



The minimum size for an urban off-leash area is .04 ha (400 m²).



Artificial turf is a recommended durable surface for small off-leash areas.



Clearly defined boundaries help to reduce conflict between park users.
