THE FIFTH CENSUS RELEASE PROVIDES INFORMATION ON INDIGENOUS PEOPLES.

The City is situated on the ancestral, traditional and unceded territories of the xwmə@kwəyəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and Səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations, who have lived on these lands since time immemorial.

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES: Collective term that refers to people who are First Nations, Métis, or Inuk (Inuit).





