### **COMPARISON OF POPULATION % CHANGE: 2016-2021**



# WHERE IS THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER?

### THE CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER

is located on the North Shore
of the Burrard Inlet, on the
traditional territory of the
x<sup>w</sup>məθkwəy əm (Musqueam),
Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and
səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations.
With a land area of 11.83 km²,
the City is a smaller community
than its North Shore neighbours
– the District of North Vancouver
and the District of West Vancouver.



### **PRIVATE DWELLINGS**

A private dwelling is defined as a set of living quarters with a private entrance either from outside the building or from a common hall, lobby, vestibule or stairway inside the building.



The number of private dwellings in the City increased by **2,595 or 9.8%** from 2016 to 2021.
