SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with an update of the Integrated Transportation Committee’s (ITC) achievements over 2025 and provide a work plan for 2026. The Committees are established to provide advice and recommendations to Council on matters defined in the Committee’s Terms of Reference or Bylaw. Staff facilitate this process through creating annual Committee Work Plans.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

ITC provides advice on multi-modal transportation matters within the City, including active transportation (walking, rolling and cycling), transit, vehicles and goods movement, as well as multi-modal integration.

The committee supports the implementation of the Mobility Strategy and Council’s 2022-2026 Strategic Plan, with a focus on the “A Connected City” priority. In 2025, ITC contributed to the Mobility Strategy and Council Strategic Plan through its review and recommendations of the following projects, policies, and development applications:

- **Complete Communities Program – Walking/Rolling Network Assessment:** input into the City’s network evaluation approach, identified network features, and data sources.

- **Curb Access and Parking Plan initial implementation and monitoring:** input into the parking changes implementation process to be considered for the future, such as communications and educational tools, as well as the long-term monitoring plan.
- **Lonsdale Great Street:** input on important transportation considerations for the future of Central Lonsdale.
- **Mobility Network Implementation Next Steps:** input into the future considerations of the City’s Mobility Network including existing and nascent modes, network development, and design features.
- **North Shore Transportation Survey:** input into contemporary focus areas for future iterations (2025, 2027 and 2029) of the survey.
- **PLN2024-00001 – 925-943 Marine Drive, 925 West 3rd Street (Capilano Mall) – Official Community Plan Amendment:** provided feedback on the application’s alignment with the Mobility Strategy goals and targets, access and connections to the site, proposed preliminary servicing arrangement, potential transportation demand measures to support active and sustainable modes of transportation and design and quality of the pedestrian realm.
- **PLN2024-00016 – 507-651 East 1st Street, 82-94 St. Davids Avenue, and 603-609, 631 East 2nd Street (The Trails) – Official Community Plan Amendment:** provided feedback on the application’s alignment with the Mobility Strategy’s goals, transportation impacts of the proposal given the proposed number of units, and proposed mobility networks (pedestrian, cycling, and vehicles).
- **PLN2024-00021 – 1540 St. Georges Avenue and 215-235 East 16th Street – Official Community Plan Amendment:** provided feedback on the application’s alignment with the Mobility Strategy goals and targets, access and connections to the site, design and quality of the secure bicycle parking and bike-related amenities, and design and quality of the pedestrian mews.
- **PLN2024-00023 – 503-536 East 3rd Street (TransLink) – Official Community Plan Amendment:** provided feedback on the application’s alignment with the Mobility Strategy’s goals and targets, access and connections to the site, proposed preliminary servicing arrangement, potential transportation demand measures to support active and sustainable modes of transportation and design and quality of the pedestrian realm.
- **Required Parking Dimensions:** provided feedback on their experience with the City’s current parking space dimensions, including with or as someone who has faced mobility challenges.
- **Draft Small-Scale Multi-Unit Housing Zone:** input on future considerations for the zone and design guidelines, as well as alignment with the Mobility Strategy goals.

ITC worked well together and provided valuable feedback for staff and Council’s consideration.

2026 WORK PLAN

In 2026, ITC will be called upon to review and provide its recommendations in respect of:

- Transportation Network Plan
- E-Bike Share – Evolve Year 1 Implementation
- Notice of Motion – Encouraging the Safe Use of Electric Mobility Devices
- Provincial Legislation Alignment – Implementation of Bill 25
- Major Development Applications
- Transportation Data Strategy
- 2026 Annual Report and 2027 Work Plan

Additionally, ITC will be invited to participate in a field trip to learn about the design elements of the Crosscut Bridge and Eastside Connector in order to promote the infrastructure to the community. This work by ITC in the coming year will provide Council with community perspectives regarding significant initiatives within the mandate of ITC, furthering Council's strategic priorities.

INTER-DEPARTMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

ITC is the responsibility of the Infrastructure, Transportation and Parks department and works closely with the Planning, Development & Real Estate, and Finance & Economic Development departments.

STRATEGIC PLAN, OCP OR POLICY ALIGNMENT

The past and future work of the ITC advances Council's Strategic Plan priority "A Connected City", and the Mobility Strategy's vision of healthy streets that work for everyone.
