advancing reconciliation;

The City of North Vancouver values Indigenous lives and is committed to

strengthening its relationships with First Nations, Metis and Inuit peoples;

Whereas the City of North Vancouver recognizes that public commemoration of the

history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of

reconciliation;

Whereas the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action #80 called on

the Federal government to establish, as a statutory holiday, a National

Day for Truth and Reconciliation to honour survivors of residential

schools, their families and communities;

Whereas the government of Canada and the Province of British Columbia marked

September 30 as a day of public commemoration and reflection;
