



YOUTH FESTIVAL RETURNS TO THE SHIPYARDS MAY 6

CITY OF NORTH VANCOUVER, BC – April 24, 2023: The City of North Vancouver is pleased to announce the return of CityFest, the largest youth-led festival in Metro Vancouver.

Led by youth, for youth, the 2023 CityFest event takes place at The Shipyards on Saturday, May 6 from 12 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Celebrated during B.C.'s annual Youth Week, CityFest showcases an assortment of local youth musicians, bands, visual artists and the skateboarding community.

"Youth Week is a celebration intended to build strong connections between youth and their communities," said Mayor Linda Buchanan "That's why the City of North Vancouver is a proud partner of CityFest. We recognize the importance of creating interactive and safe spaces for youth to connect, learn and have fun. The festival will feature various activities and entertainment, including a longboard race, skateboarding competition, live music performed by local youth, art exhibits and food trucks.
