City of North Vancouver - Accessible Parking Signage Guide

To use an accessible parking space in the City of North Vancouver, your vehicle must display a valid permit from the Social Planning and Research Council (SPARC). Find out who is eligible and how to apply at sparc.bc.ca.



Where you can park for free with a SPARC Permit



On-street accessible parking spaces operated by the City. Some of these spaces may have a 4-hour time limit in high-demand areas. Please follow any posted time limits on accessible parking signs.



Accessible parking spaces in City-owned offstreet parking lots. Time limits apply where posted. Privately operated lots may charge for accessible parking.

FREE



Time-limited Except with Permit areas. SPARC permit holders can park for up to 72 hours. This is the maximum time allowed for any vehicle under section 505 of the Street and Traffic Bylaw.



Pay Parking Except with Permit areas. SPARC permit holders can park for up to 72 hours. SPARC permits are valid in any location where the sign reads 'except with permit'.

PAY

A SPARC permit does not provide free parking in Pay Parking areas (where signs DO NOT say 'except with permit'). You may park in these areas, but you must pay the posted hourly rates where the sign shown on the right is displayed.
