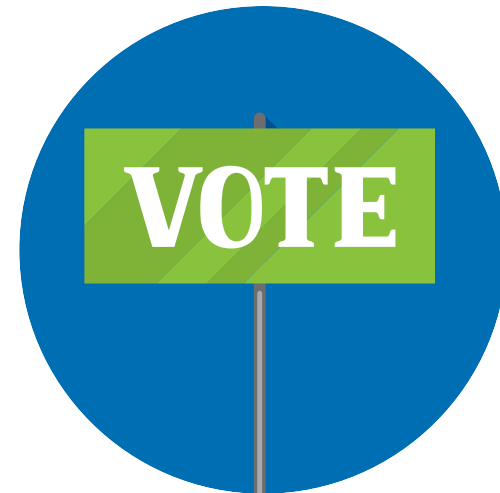

GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Local government has the most impact on our day-to-day lives and is considered the most accessible level of government. With exceptional services and amenities, the City of North Vancouver is one of the most livable communities in the Lower Mainland.

The City is responsible for providing important services to our residents, including: clean drinking water, garbage and recycling collection, road and sidewalk maintenance, efficient sewage systems, police and fire services, library, recreation centres and parks.

WHY VOTE?

Do you know that City Council makes most of the decisions that shape our community? And, the Board of Education makes many of the policy decisions for North Vancouver schools? It's up to you to elect a Council and a School Board that you feel will make good decisions on your behalf. Voting is your chance to impact the future of the City and to have your say in local government.



On General Voting Day, voters in the City of North Vancouver will vote to elect the following:

- Mayor** (1 to be elected)
- City Councillors** (6 to be elected)
- School Trustees** (3 to be elected)

WHO CAN VOTE?

To vote in the election you must be at least 18 years of age and a Canadian citizen. You must have been living in BC for at least six months and have been living in the City of North Vancouver for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration. If you own property in the City of North Vancouver, but don't reside in the city, you may also qualify to vote.

HOW DO I REGISTER TO VOTE?

If you are not already registered as an elector, you can register on voting day. Please bring two pieces of identification (one with a signature) to prove your identity and residency.

WHERE AND WHEN DO I VOTE?

Voting places will be open from 8am to 8pm on General Voting Day. You may vote at Carson Graham Secondary School, John Braithwaite Community Centre, Larson Elementary School, Memorial Recreation Centre, North Shore Neighbourhood House, Queen Mary Elementary School, Ridgeway Elementary School, Sutherland Secondary School and Westview Elementary School. All voting locations are wheelchair accessible.

If you cannot vote on General Voting Day, there are opportunities for Advance Voting and for Mail Ballot Voting. Please contact us for more information.

HOW CAN I DECIDE WHO TO VOTE FOR?

There are many opportunities to meet candidates and learn where they stand on local issues. Consult local newspapers, the candidates' websites, and the City's website for information on candidates and for the schedules of All-Candidates Meetings. Attend a meeting and take the opportunity to ask candidates how they plan to address issues that are important to you.

Your vote counts. Please vote on General Voting Day.
